Betsy Parrish Success of program based on the data (benefits): The benefits of the first goal, using ELA standards to teach my curriculum, is that students will be getting exposure to those standards both in their classrooms and in library. The second goal, project-based learning helps students with teamwork, problem solving, perseverance, and realworld exposure to problems. Recommended changes needed to achieve the goals and objectives of the program: Changes for next year need to include better inclusion of coding into core subject areas. Action to be taken: Mrs. Vannoy and I need to come up with a push-in schedule that will meet the needs of teachers and fit into my schedule, as well. I also need to keep up to date with teachers on their current standards to tie in with what they are teaching in the classrooms. Change made in the last year: In the last year I have added fifth grade library helpers who have taken on duties such as checking in books, cleaning, organizing, and shelving books. I have started teaching Common Sense Media lessons and will take that on exclusively next year for classroom teachers. This year I started a small group to focus on fine motor skills with kindergarten and first grade students. It was a huge success and those students made great strides in their fine motor abilities over the course of the year. This year, we also had our two highest grossing Book Fairs yet, and plan to purchase robots that will travel to classrooms with the revenue from that. In the High School the iPad check in/out system has been a success and has increased circulation in the library since students are not dependent on my being present.
